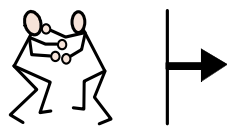
By 1915 the western front had become a stalemate.



Neither side could see a way to win.











Trenches were dug from the English Channel to Switzerland.















 Germany joined with The Ottoman Empire against the allies.

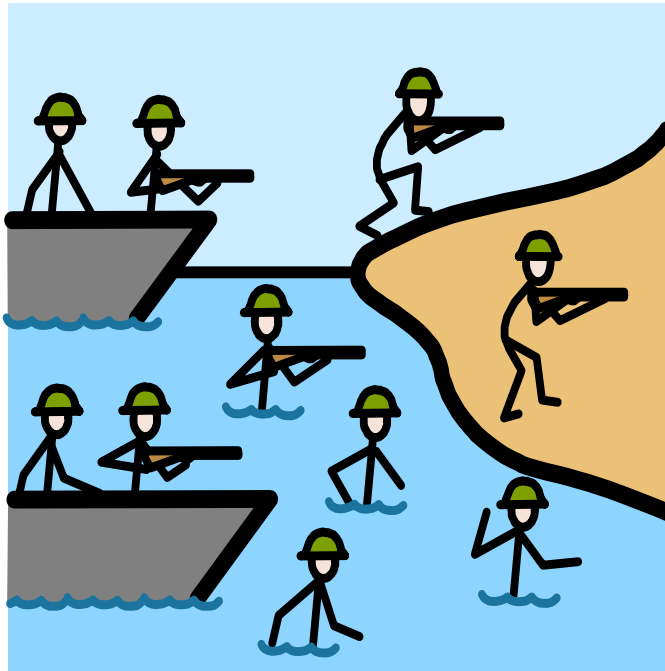
















 The Ottomans ruled Turkey and the Middle East.











 Britain and France saw a way to win.






 The plan was to invade Gallipoli in Turkey.



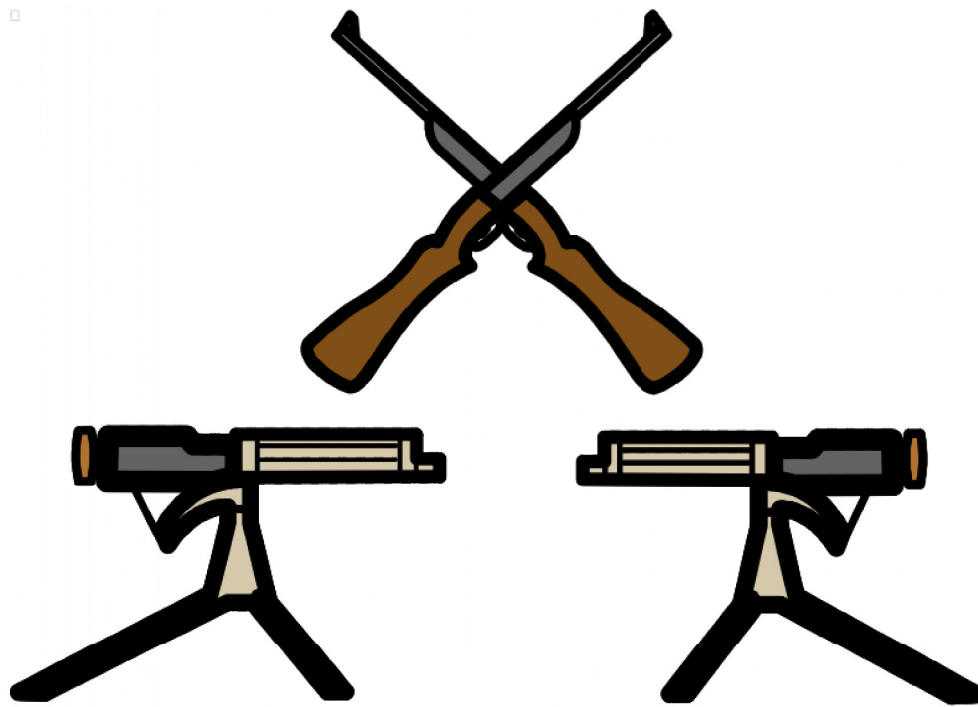







 Britain and France sent ships to Turkey.

 The first troops landed on 25th April 1915.












 It was the largest sea attack ever.

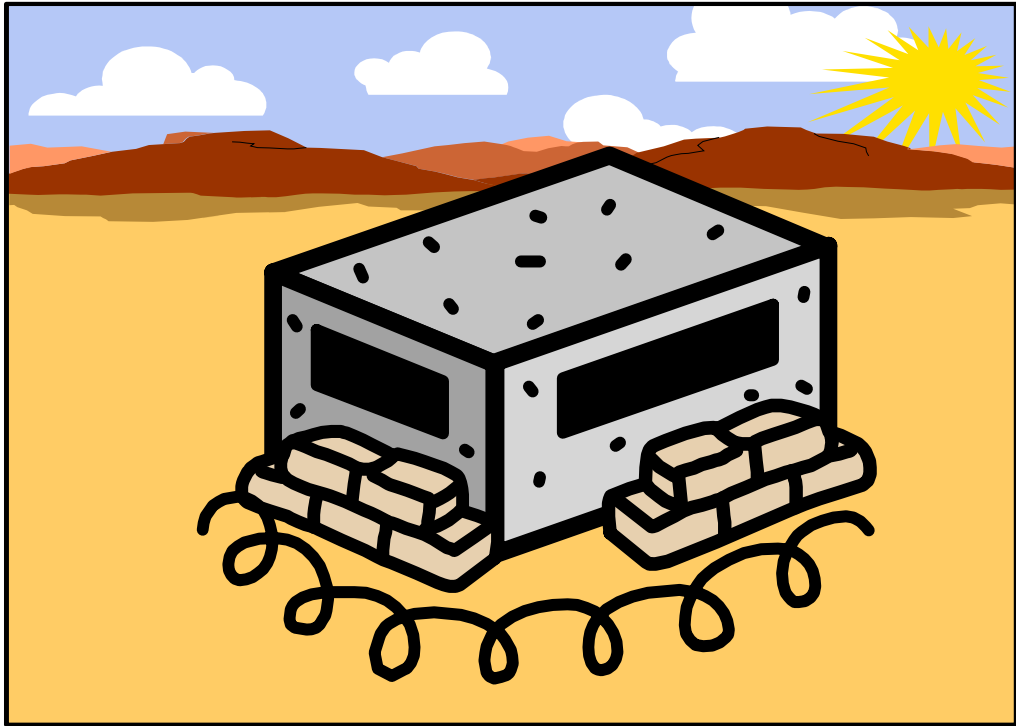
















 Britain and France thought they could surprise the Ottomans.








 But the Ottomans knew the soldiers were coming to invade.







 The battle was very fierce.












 The Allies had to fight uphill from the beaches.

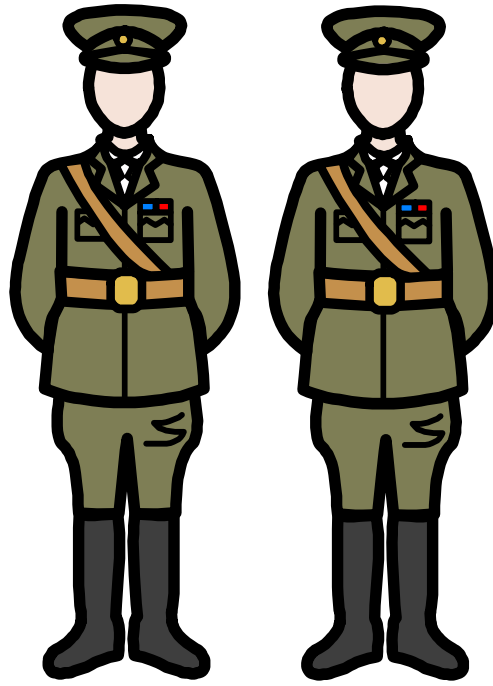













 Britain and France were too confident before the invasion.

 During winter there was snow and rain.

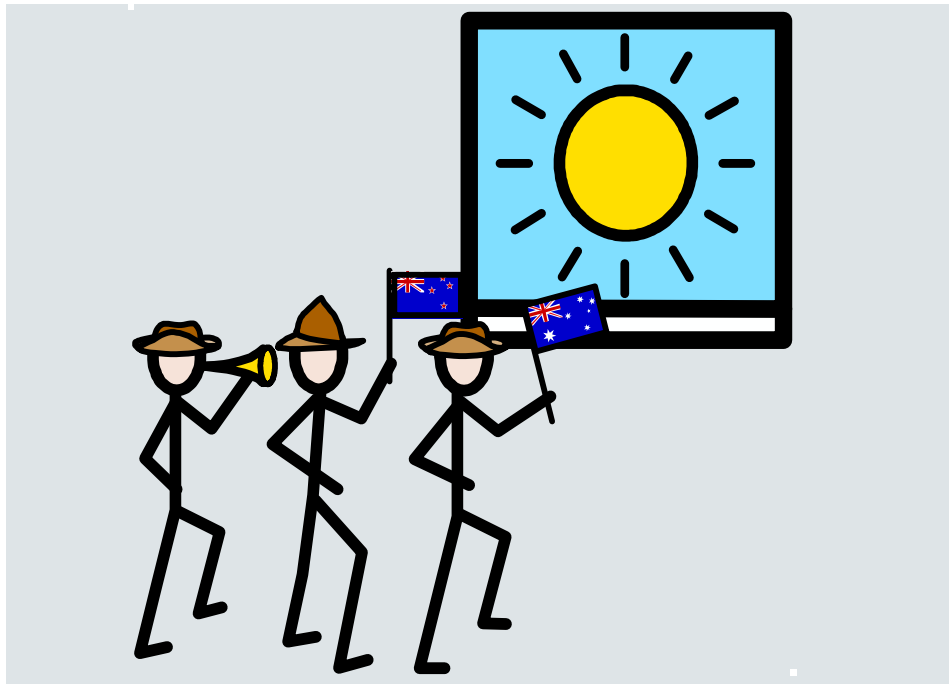









 The Allied soldiers retreated.



















 The attack on Gallipoli was a failure.










 Troops from Australia and New Zealand joined the allies.

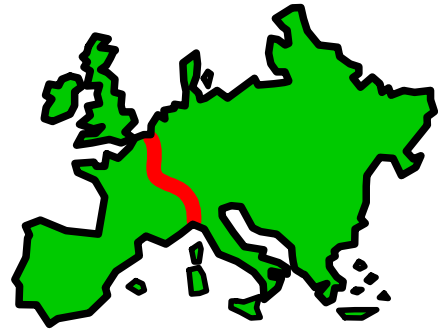



 They were called the ANZACs.






 Many ANZAC soldiers were killed in Gallipoli.

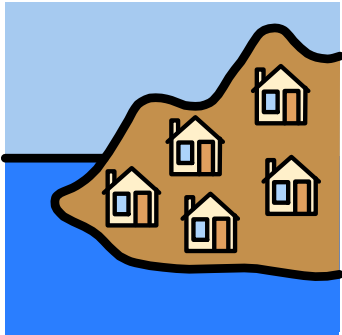






 The ANZAC Day of remembrance is the 25th of April.



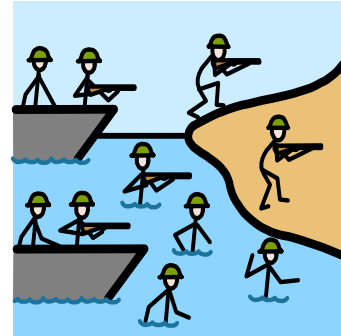
